HHSC Agreements

- g. Consider approval of the FY26-28 Outreach, Screening, Assessment, Referral (OSAR) contract #HHS001644600012. The OSAR program provides coordinated access to a continuum of substance use and other community services. Amount not to exceed \$1,497,960.
- h. Consider approval of the FY26-27 MH performance contract #HHS001598600035. This contract provides funding for mental health adult and youth outpatient services, inpatient hospital beds, crisis, veterans, and PASRR MI services. Amount not to exceed \$42,246,414.
- i. Consider approval of the FY26-27 Texas Correctional Office on Offenders w/Medical or Mental Impairments (TCOOMMI) contract #699-TC-26-27-LO52. The purpose of this contract is to provide continuity of care and intensive case management to persons on probation or parole to facilitate community integration and reduce recidivism. Amount not to exceed \$920,000 which is an increase of \$88,000 from previous allocation.
- j. Consider amendment #7 to the FY25 Outreach, Screening, Assessment, Referral (OSAR) contract #HHS000782500005. The OSAR program provides coordinated access to a continuum

of substance use and other community services. The purpose of this amendment is to decrease funding in the amount of \$129,887 due to the expiration of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds.

- k. Consider approval of the FY26-30 HHSC Substance Use Treatment Service contract #HHS001535500114. This contract provides funding for substance use outpatient programs to include Treatment for Adult (TRA), Treatment for Youth (TRY) and Treatment for Females (TRF) as well as funds for subcontracted residential services. Total amount not to exceed \$11,061,435 for 5-year term. FY 2026 (September 1, 2025- August 31, 2026) allocations are as follows:

This contract provides funding for the provision of case management services to individuals eligible for intensive residential substance use services. CCMS services will reduce barriers to treatment, enhance motivation, encourage treatment retention, and strengthen resources for recovery. Total amount not to exceed \$1,021,635 for 5-year term. FY26 allocation is \$204,327.

From the Chief Executive Officer

On July 4, 2025, historic amounts of rain fell on Central Texas and parts of West Texas, tragically taking the lives of more than 130 people, many of whom were young children. The trauma created in the immediate aftermath and the days, weeks, months and even years that follow these events is immense. Hill Country MHDD Centers, Bluebonnet Trails Community Services, Integral Care and MHMR Concho Valley provide services in areas directly impacted by these historic rainfall events.

To address the flooding in Kerr County, Tom Green County, Williamson County and Travis County, the Speaker of the House and Lieutenant Governor each named a Select Committee to study the issues, hear from experts and make recommendations for lasting change in our state's emergency response systems.

Select Committee recommendations follow:

- **Increase Funding for Crisis Mental Health Services**
 - Expand Mobile Crisis Outreach Teams
 - Provide Mobile Mental Health Crisis Response Vehicles
 - Crisis Center operational capacity
- **Enhance Local Mental Health Authority (LMHA) system outpatient capacity**
 - Investment for ongoing outpatient services post disaster and long-term mental health service/supports for impacted individuals
- **Support more frequent statewide specialized crisis and disaster response training**
- **Strengthen integration of disaster behavioral health into Incident Command Centers**

If there was ever a silver lining from a tragedy of such horrific magnitude, it is the hope that our state will strengthen community services to ensure that not only does our system have the capacity to meet the moment in a major disaster, but that we are present and available every day for people in need of our services.

Legislative Update

The first special session of the 89th Legislature adjourned sine die on Friday, August 15. The second special session began immediately after adjournment and will run for a further 30 days. [Governor Abbott announced 19 priority items](#) for this session, including youth camp safety, flooding and recovery, property taxes, and redistricting.

Youth Crisis Outreach Teams (YCOTs)

Funding for eight additional youth crisis outreach team (YCOT) sites was included in Rider 54 of the 89th Legislative Session's budget bill, HB 1. This will double the number of sites in Texas. HHSC developed a methodology for identifying potential new sites and is currently in contract negotiations. Rider 54 included direction for the agency to focus expansion on urban areas.

Drawing on lessons learned over the past year, Texas Council convened a panel to discuss YCOT at the recent Texas Council Conference in Dallas on June 25, 2025. Panelists were:

Through the coordinated efforts of the sites, Texas Council, MMHPI, and HHSC, the initial cohort of YCOT implementation has been highly successful and has demonstrated that the YCOT model is effective in helping kids and families quickly access care. The work of the learning collaborative will be invaluable in guiding further expansion and continued implementation.

Youth Empowerment Services (YES) Waiver

Since the YES Waiver's inception, administrative and other barriers have limited the program's full implementation. The recent heightened focus on DFPS-involved youth and recommendations related to YES in the Children's Behavioral Health Strategic Plan (CBHSP) contributed to the timeliness of a recent meeting between Texas Council staff, Center leadership, and HHSC. As a result of this discussion, HHSC agreed to form a workgroup to delve into these and other systemic issues within YES Waiver, with the goal of collaboratively identifying and implementing policy improvements.

The workgroup had its initial meeting on Thursday, August 7, 2025. HHSC staff provided updates on several initiatives they were working on, such as revamping the YES manual and creating a video to better orient parents to the Waiver and its requirements. They also noted that the number of youth on YES Waiver interest lists statewide has dropped, thanks to diligent efforts on the part of Center staff. Over the next six months, the group will address significant operational topics like inappropriate referrals, contract management, parent engagement and accountability, fair hearings, and more.

Outpatient Biopsychosocial Initiative (OBI) for People with IDD

HHSC recently announced the OBI initiative will expand to eight new sites in FY26 thanks to additional funding approved by the 89th Legislature. Consistent with the five existing sites, the new sites will provide outpatient mental health services for children and adults with IDD. HHSC will soon announce its selection of the sites, based in part on direct survey responses from Local IDD Authorities gauging interest and capacity.

Peer and Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) Special Interest Groups

Texas Council established the Koalafied Outreach Worker Star Award (KOWSA) to recognize MHFA Outreach Workers who exemplify great leadership. Recent winners are:

- April 2025 – Angie Bates, MHMR Authority of Brazos Valley
- May 2025 – Jason Vaquera, MHMR Concho Valley
- June 2025 – Isaac Lopez, Central Plains Center

The Peer/Family Partner Steering Committee, a Texas Council Special Interest Group, was tasked with developing a toolbox for the LMHAs/LBHAs. The Steering Committee has developed several resources; however, these tools are often underutilized due to limited awareness among participants. To address this, the Steering Committee will begin sending out a monthly update. Currently available in the toolbox:

The Texas Council hosted its 38th Annual Conference in Dallas from June 25-27, 2025, and it was an event to remember!

- 887 participants, exhibitors, volunteers, speakers, and guests registered for the conference.
- 601 conference attendees used our event-management mobile app to enhance their participation and earn continuing education credits.
- 60 non-member participants joined our event.
- Conference sponsors across all levels, excluding event-level, brought in \$43,000, representing a 17% increase from the 2024 Conference
- Exhibitors filled the exhibit hall to capacity, representing \$40,650 in revenue, equivalent to 2024.

We received additional helpful feedback we will consider as we improve future conference experiences. The final accounting of conference proceeds is in progress and results will be available by the November 2025 quarterly meeting.

Historically Underutilized Business (HUB) Subcontracting Plan**

Last Revision Date: September 15, 2025

Initial Date: July 12th, 1995

I. Policy

In accordance with the Texas Government Code, Sections 2161.181-182 and Title 34, Rule 20.281 of the Texas Administrative Code (TAC), The Gulf Coast Center ("Center") shall make a good faith effort to utilize Historically Underutilized Businesses (HUBs) in contracts for construction services, including professional and consulting services; and commodities contracts. The HUB Rules promulgated by the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts (the "Texas Comptroller"), set forth in 34 TAC Rules 20.281-20.298, encourage the use of HUBs by implementing these policies through race-, ethnic- and gender-neutral means.

It is the policy of the Center to promote full and equal business opportunities for all businesses in State contracting in accordance with Center specific or statewide HUB goals as specified in TAC Rule 20.284:

- 11.2% for heavy construction other than building contracts;
- 21.1% for all building construction, including general contractors and operative builders contracts;
- 32.9% for all special trade construction contracts;
- 23.7% for professional services contracts
- 26% for all other services contracts, and
- 21.1% for commodities contracts.

The Center shall make a good faith effort to meet or exceed these goals to assist HUBs in receiving a portion of the total contract value of all contracts that the Center expects to award in a fiscal year. The Center may achieve the annual program goals by contracting directly with HUBs or indirectly through subcontracting opportunities in accordance with the Texas Government Code, Chapter 2161, Subchapter F.

For the purpose of this policy, a Historically Underutilized Business (HUB) is defined as a corporation, sole proprietorship, partnership, or joint venture formed for profit with Texas as its principal place of business. Additionally, it is a for-profit entity that has not exceeded the size standards prescribed by 34 TAC§20.294, has its principal place of business in Texas, and is at least 51% owned by Black Americans, Hispanic Americans, American Women, Asian Pacific Americans, and Native Americans and/or Service Disabled Veterans. These persons must reside in Texas and actively participate in the control, operation and management of the entities' affairs.

In accordance with 34 TAC §20.281, the Center will make a good faith effort to utilize HUBs in contracts for construction, services (including professional and consulting services), and commodities purchases. To the extent legally practicable, the Center will ensure that all contractors providing services, materials, or supplies to the Center, provide employment opportunities to HUB's equal to those provided to all other groups or individuals. Such contractors will also be expected to take positive steps toward the utilization of HUB's to the maximum extent feasible, consistent with sound procurement principles and applicable laws.

When requested, the Center will provide assistance to HUB's by providing instructions on the preparation of bid specifications, compliance with procurement policy, and fulfillment of general bid requirements. Additionally, the Center will provide information on job performance requirements, procurement opportunities, and prerequisites for bidding on contracts.

The Center will encourage joint ventures among HUB's and majority and minority firms bidding for Center contracts.

The Center will seek and use its best efforts to ensure HUB's are informed of current and future procurement activities through newsletters, minority newspapers, local minority chambers of commerce, and other minority organizations as well as through direct contact with minority entrepreneurs.

As designated by the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Center, primary responsibility for the implementation and administration of the Center's HUB Subcontracting Plan will be that of the Center's Authority Services. To further evidence and support its intent to vigorously pursue the objectives of the HUB policy, the CEO shall also designate appropriate Center staff personnel as HUB Liaisons. These HUB Liaisons – primarily service area management personnel – will assist the Center's Authority Services in implementing the Center's HUB Subcontracting Plan and achieving the stated goals. Their positions within the Center and its' services, will further the Center's opportunities to assure HUB vendor's inclusion and education.

II. Historically Underutilized Business Subcontracting Plan

A. Responsibility. *The CEO of the Gulf Coast Center ("Center") will designate the Center's Authority Services as primarily responsible for the implementation, administration, and monitoring of the Center's Historically Underutilized Business ("HUB") Subcontracting Plan. The designation will be clearly identified on the Center's primary organizational chart. The Center's Authority Services management staff will:*

- Develop, manage, implement, and evaluate the HUB Subcontracting Plan
- Disseminate information on available business opportunities so that HUB's are provided an equitable opportunity to bid
- Maintain and update a directory of HUB's
- Provide training and information regarding HUB requirements to staff involved in procurement and/or purchasing
- Provide assistance to Center departments in resolving specific problems related to implementation of the HUB Subcontracting Plan and achievement of stated goals
- Advise prospective contractors and others on necessary steps to bring them into compliance with requirements regarding HUB participation
- Attend pre-bid and pre-construction conferences to explain HUB requirements and to respond to questions when applicable
- Review bid proposals prior to formal advertising to ensure that proper instructions are included regarding HUB requirements
- Review bids after they have been opened to verify the degree of HUB participation and to assure that those firms listed have been properly certified based on established criteria
- Maintain accurate and up-to-date records demonstrating HUB efforts and accomplishments
- Assist in the arrangement of joint ventures between minority and non-minority firms and between two or more minority firms
- Submit all reports as required

B. Procurement. *The Center's Authority Services will develop and use affirmative action techniques to facility HUB participation in contracting activities. These techniques will include, but not limited to:*

- Arrange solicitations, time for the presentation of bids, quantities, specifications, and delivery schedules so as to facilitate the participation of HUB's
- Provide assistance to HUB's in overcoming barriers such as the inability to obtain bonding, financing, or technical assistance by working with outside agencies to provide these resources where possible.
- Carry out information and communication programs on contracting procedures and specific contracting opportunities in a timely manner
- Hold pre-bid conferences to explain projects and encourage prime contractors to use HUB subcontractors
- Include the Center's goal requirement for HUB participation in the bid solicitations appropriate projects

- C. HUB Directory.** *The Center's Authority Services will maintain a directory of HUB vendors. To the extent possible, the Center will include those HUB vendors included on the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts Centralized Master Bidder's List for Galveston and Brazoria Counties.*
- D. Eligibility and Joint Ventures.** *To ensure that the HUB Subcontracting Plan only benefits those firms owned and controlled by identified disadvantaged individuals, the Center will certify the eligibility of the HUB and joint ventures involving HUB's that are named by competitors. The Center shall require prime contractors to make good faith efforts to replace a HUB contractor that is unable to perform successfully with another HUB. The Center shall reserve the right to approve all substitutions of subcontractors before bid opening and during contract performance, in order to ensure that the substitute firms are eligible HUB's.*
- E. Percentage Goals**
- **Overall Goals.** The overall goals of the Center's HUB Subcontracting Plan are 10% of the contract amount for HUB's. In no case shall this constitute a fixed quota. The overall goal shall be reviewed on at least an annual basis, and shall include an analysis of HUB participation during the fiscal year. In arriving at this goal, the following factors were considered:
 - The number and type of contracts to be awarded during the fiscal year
 - The number and types of HUB's identified by the Center
 - The number and types of HUB's likely to be available to complete for contracts during the fiscal year
 - Past history and efforts of the Center to contract with HUB's
 - **Contract Goals.** Contract goals will be set on specific projects that the bidder/proposer must meet or exceed or demonstrate that it could not meet despite its' best efforts. The goals will be set based on the known availability of qualified HUB's.
 - **Publication of Goals.** When required, at the time the Center submits its overall goals for approval, the Center shall publish a notice announcing these goals, informing the public that the goals and a description of how they were selected, are available for inspection during normal business hours at the Center's office for thirty (30) days following the date of the notice. The notice shall include address to which comments may be sent, and shall be published in general circulation media and available minority-focus media and trade association publications, and shall state that the comments are for informational purposes only.
 - **Geographic Area.** The Center and contractors shall, at a minimum, seek HUB's in the same geographical area in which the contractor or subcontractors are sought for a given solicitation. If the goals cannot be met by using HUB's from this geographical area, the Center and contractors shall expand the search to a reasonably wider area.
- F. Identification by Name.** *In solicitations for contracts that provide opportunities for HUB participation, the Center shall indicate its goals for the use of firms owned and controlled by identified disadvantage individuals.*
- All bidders/proposers will be required to submit a written assurance of meeting the goals in their bids of proposals
 - Within a reasonable period of time after the opening of bids and before the award of the contract, the Center shall require all bidders wishing to remain in competition for the contract to submit information that provides:
 - Names and addresses of HUB subcontractors;
 - Description of the work each is to perform; and
 - Dollar value of each proposed HUB subcontract
 - The time allowed for submission of this information will be set for individual contracts and may vary, depending on the circumstances
 - Agreements between a bidder/proposer and a HUB in which the HUB promises not to provide subcontracting quotations to other bidders/proposers are prohibited

G. Compliance. All subrecipients, contractors, and subcontractors must comply with the HUB requirements outlined in the Center's HUB Subcontracting Plan.

H. Maintenance of Records

- In order to maintain and monitor the progress of its HUB Subcontracting Plan, the Center shall maintain a recordkeeping system that will identify and assess HUB contract awards, prime contractor's progress in achieving HUB subcontract goals, and other HUB affirmative action efforts
- Specific to the Center, records will be maintained indicating
 - Procedures that have been adopted to comply with the requirements of this program; and
 - Awards to HUB's (these awards will be measured against project awards and/or goals)
- Records will be available upon request under existing information policies
- As required, the Center shall submit reports conforming in frequency and format to reporting requirements
- The records and reports shall provide information relating to firms owned and controlled by an identified disadvantaged individual(s)

I. Contract Document Information

- HUB Obligation(s). The Center and/or its subcontractors agree to take all reasonable and available action to ensure that HUB's have the maximum opportunity to compete and/or participate in the performance of contracts and subcontracts.
- Center Obligation(s). The Center shall advise subrecipients, contractors, or subcontractors that failure to carry out the requirements set forth in this program shall constitute a breach of contract and could result in termination of the agreement or contract
- Other Obligation(s). Additionally, the following items will be provided to prospective bidders in the specific documents:
 - HUB goals;
 - HUB selection criteria;
 - Certification schedules;
 - HUB definitions;
 - Methods of counting HUB participation;
 - Form for reporting names and addresses of HUB subcontractors, work to be performed, and dollar value of each proposed HUB contract;
 - Eligibility standards;
 - Guidance for making determinations for social or economic disadvantage;
 - Challenge procedure; and
 - Appeals of denial of certification as a HUB
